Casa Hogar Mission Trip

On January 6-14 our Newman group of 15 traveled to Lima, Peru, to help serve at Casa Hogar, the orphanage run by the Diocese of La Crosse. The week was filled with opportunities to learn about Casa's positive impact on the lives of those in Peru and those from our diocese who visit there. It is a unique orphanage in that they employ eight married couples each of whom raises up to eight orphans. The 'families' are categorized by age and gender and include any biological children that the couple may have.

What struck me was that the focus of the trip was not on the 'work' we came to do (a relatively small amount) but on how we ourselves were going to be impacted and would share this experience coming home. The current Director of Casa Hogar, Monsignor Hirsch, referred to this as 'reverse mission'. It was quite humbling to realize that we had so much to receive from this beautiful and peaceful place.

Mass at 7 am Service of Ashes at 12:00 noon, 5 pm, and 6 pm


Parking for the noon Ash Wednesday service is available in the UWEC Water Street Lot from 11 am to



ast year the Century Club campaign was moved from being run by the ERC to each parish: Newman and ULC. It was a good success for us, Newman Parish collected \$11,050. Thank you!

In 2019 this money was used to pay the ERC assessment. The ERC assessment is our share of the costs to maintain, operate and make improvements to the ERC. Last year the assessment included redoing the landscaping work in front of the ERC after the Garfield construction was complete and also for the replacement of the windows in the back of the Centrum. The windows in the Centrum are also being paid for in this 2020 budget as it was a larger expense, so the money we collect will help to finish paying off that cost.

Please consider contributing \$100.00 to the Century Club campaign. Checks can be made out to **Newman Parish** and the money collected will be used to pay the Newman portion of the ERC assessment.
